- A.** All entries will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations and to the Special Rules of this department.
- B.** Premiums for this show will be paid by the West Texas Fair & Rodeo.
- C.** All cattle must be from a registered sire and dam.
- D.** All animals must be registered in the herdbook of the Am. Angus Assoc. The registration certificate issue date must be prior to the show date.
- E.** The skin color of all animals must be BLACK, except those animals having birth marks or white hairs on black skin.
- F.** All animals must be polled (free of horns or scurs).
- G.** All animals must have a legible ear tattoo for identification. The tattoo must correspond w/tattoo # on the official certificate. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
- H.** Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show.
- I.** Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.
- J.** DNA for Parentage Verification-Each animal may be subjected to a DNA test to verify ACCURACY OF PARENTAGE as covered under Assoc. Rules Part 3, Sec. XI, Rule 2(a).
- K.** The Fair Association does not pay a percentage on premiums offered in Championship Classes.
- L.** If less than 50 head are entered, all early and late classes may be combined at the discretion of Show Officials.
- M.** No entry fee will be charged for cow/calf or other group classes. No premium will be paid on these classes.

SPECIAL RULES

- A. All entries will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations and to the Special Rules of this department.
- B. All animals to be eligible for an Open Charolais Breeding Class must be purebred and registered with the American-International Charolais Association (AICA). Only bona fide (original) certificates of registration will be accepted as evidence of registration and ownership; NO PHOTOCOPIES.
- C. An animal is eligible to enter or compete in an open Charolais breeding class if registered in country of origin outside the United States and is eligible for purebred registry in the AICA Herdbook.
- D. All animals to be eligible may be approved by a sifting committee designated by the AICA. Stall space will not be provided for any Charolais cattle that have not been accepted by the sifting committee.
- E. All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age, and each animal will be present in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification. Use of artificial tailheads is not permitted.
- F. Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing.
- G. Bulls from classes 36, 37, 40, 41, and 42 must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.
- H. All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the Cow-Calf Class and calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2008. Calves at side must be purebred and registered with the AICA. Females calved after September 1, 2008, must show in individual female class appropriate to age. Nurse cows are not permitted.
- I. All females 20 months and older exhibited at AICA

sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.

J. AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and suggest that all bulls be shown with a nose lead.

K. ALL EXHIBITS OF CHAROLAIS BREEDING CATTLE SHALL BE GOVERNED BY THE AICA RULES AND REGULATIONS, ARTICLE XV, TITLED EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS. THE INSPECTION OF EXHIBIT CATTLE IS SPECIFIED IN ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH C, OF THE ASSOCIATION RULES AND REGULATIONS AND NONCOMPLIANCE OF EXHIBIT INSPECTION IS SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH D OF THE SAME ARTICLE XV.

L. ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH B, POINT 2: "Each animal will be presented in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical or other (including banding or other circulatory constriction) appearance change for cosmetic purpose, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method per os (by esophagus) is prohibited. Silicone injection or other injection for cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited. Anabolic steroid use shall likewise be prohibited and any animal testing positive for anabolic steroid or diuretic use shall be presumed to be altered and modified."

M. Effective October 22, 2004, at any American-International Charolais Association (AICA) sanctioned show (including shows receiving AICA premium funding and/or qualifying as a Roll of Excellence Show), the use of a coloring agent, flock and powder is prohibited. Use of these products will result in the immediate disqualification of a given animal at such show.

N. No entry fee will be charged for cow/calf or other group classes. No premium will be paid on these classes.

- A. All entries will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations and to the Special Rules of this department.
- B. Active adult and junior members of the ACA are eligible to show and/or receive premium monies provided by the ACA. Partial interest owners must be active members of the ACA. membership may be obtained by writing ACA, P.O. Box 890, Platte City, MO 64079 or by phoning (816) 431-2308.
- C. **All cattle entered must be registered in the ACA herdbook. Cattle will not be shown with an application for registration.**
- D. **Original registration certificates must be presented to the Superintendent at the show.** Every animal's tattoo will be read and must agree with the registration certificate. Any animal not having a legible tattoo, or a tattoo not corresponding with its registration certificate, will be barred from showing.
- E. The surgical or non-surgical alteration of conformation of an animal is prohibited. This includes altering the conformation by tying up the dewlap or creating tucks by using adhesive on the dewlap, brisket, sheath, or navel. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.
- F. In order to determine that animals are polled, scurred, or horned, **NO ALTERING** of heads or removal of scurs from Chiangus cattle is permitted. **If AChiangus Head Has Been Altered In Any Way, That Animal Will Not Be Eligible To Show In The Chiangus Division.**
- G. All horned Chianina must be dehorned prior to the show. The use of false tail heads is prohibited. The addition of hair or hemp or any similar substance to any part of an animal's body is prohibited. Dying or artificially changing the color of an animal is prohibited. Coloring agents, except powders, may be used on legs and tail switches. No coloring agent may be used above an animal's flank. **No Powder Of Any Kind May Be Used On Any Part Of An Animal.**
- H. Every bull one year of age or older must have a permanent nose ring with a lead attached to the ring.
- I. All cattle will be made available for a veterinary examination to determine the presence of altering and/or determination of horns or scurs. All cattle will be made

available for a veterinary examination to be mouthed. Every exhibitor agrees to abide by the determinations of the examining veterinarian(s).

J. No entry fee will be charged for cow/calf or other group classes. No premium will be paid on these classes.

J. BY ENTERING CATTLE IN THIS SHOW, THE EXHIBITOR AGREES TO ABIDE BY ALL SHOW RULES. Although these decisions are sometimes subjective, they are made by the most competent, knowledgeable people available and their decision will be final.

All entries will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations and to the Special Rules of this department.

1. All animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation. Any animal over 30 days of age, including calves to be shown at side of dam, must have proof of a registration certificate and be recorded with the North American Limousin Foundation. For ET calves, parentage verification paperwork must be in the NALF system.
2. All animals must be 75% (3/4) Limousin or greater as indicated by registration certificate, with 25-12.5% Angus or Red Angus with up to 12.5% of unknown or other breeds. All percentages will be NALF calculated percentages. Orange paper percentage and purebred Limousin cattle shall compete in the same classes and championships.
3. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must properly match the registration certificate. If an animal's tattoo is not legible and cannot be read the first time through processing, it will not be allowed to come back through with a fresh tattoo. Fresh tattoos are acceptable but animals that do not have legible tattoos when first processed will not be reprocessed.
4. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows, the North American Limousin Foundation reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include the following: **a)** any use of paints, hair coloring conditioners, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders or any other substances; all animals subject to white towel test; **b)** The addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tail heads and false polls (false tail switches are allowed); **c)** The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal or the injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation; **d)** Any products/solutions/liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is

prohibited. This includes the use of steroids, growth promotants, and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method.

EXCEPTIONS: In the case of severely sick or severely dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the licensed official show veterinarian with the approval of the show superintendent and/or North American Limousin Foundation representative.

This exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.

5. All bulls over one (1) year of age must show with a nose-lead. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the Limousin show superintendent and the show management.
6. All protests against exhibitors, individual animals or fitting violations of show cattle must be submitted in writing and signed by five (5) active members of the North American Limousin Foundation and presented to the show superintendent within 12 hours after the completion of the show.
7. The North American Limousin Foundation reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development at any show sponsored by the Foundation.
8. All cattle will be processed before the show.
9. In shows occurring after January 1, 2009; animals born through August 31, 2008 are eligible to show.
10. The North American Limousin Foundation reserves the right to collect hair samples from any animal, at any show.
11. All animals shown must be solid red or black above the flanks, except birth marks.

Failure to have documentation on file at NALF by this date will result in disqualification from the MOE program and no points will be awarded. - A. All entries in this department are subject to the General Rules and Regulations, the Junior Livestock Show Rules, and the Special Rules of this department.
- B. The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Blvd., St. Joseph, Missouri 64506, will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for Junior Angus heifers, as included in its standard show classifications, according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown the previous year. The Association contributions will be as follows: 15-24 head - \$100 lump sum, 25-50 head - \$300 lump sum, 51-75 head - \$375 lump sum, 76-100 head - \$450 lump sum, 101-125 head - \$600 lump sum, 126 or more head - \$1,000 lump sum. A minimum of fifteen (15) head must be shown in the junior Angus heifer classes to receive American Angus premium participation. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums. The Association contributions will be included in the premium checks issued by the show.
- C. Separate classes for bred and owned heifers may be held if the size of the show merits a separate class.
- D. To be eligible for Association premiums the entries must be recorded in the sole name of the Junior exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership. The Association's contribution is included in the total premiums listed in each class.
- E. Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay a percentage on premiums offered in championship classes. An animal may only be counted one time toward the total count for premium participation by the Association.
- F. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. Any animal, upon Check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent

identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.

G. Any female shown with a calf at side, the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and the calf must be registered by show date and have the original registration certificate at check in.

H. Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.

J. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids, growth stimulants or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.

K. Effective July 1, 2005, at any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various test designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas.

L. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

M. Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

N. Date of ownership after July 1, 2010 is process dates, prior to July 1, 2010 will be issue date.

SPECIAL RULES

- A. All entries in this department are subject to the General Rules and Regulations, the Junior Livestock Show Rules, and the Special Rules of this department.
- B. Open only to members of the Junior Beefmaster Breeders Association (JBBA).
- C. Each exhibitor should have continually and personally fed and cared for their heifer(s) under the direct supervision of a County Agent, Vo-Ag instructor and/or his parents.
- D. Entries must be exhibited by the owner unless he/she has two entries in the same class, whereupon another bona fide JBBA exhibitor may show one of the entries. In a pairs class, the cow must be exhibited by the owner.
- E. Any JBBA exhibitor who is a qualified entrant to show and cannot, due to illness or injury while attending the show, may have their entry shown by another bona fide JBBA exhibitor.
- F. Exhibitors must be a minimum of six years old on January 1 of the year of the show.
- G. Official Interstate Health certificates must accompany all cattle and must be presented to a representative of the show at the time cattle arrive on the show premises. Each heifer must be tested for T.B. and Bangs in accordance with federal and state regulations. Such tests must be made by a federally accredited laboratory.
- H. Original BBU Certificate of Breeding (not copies) on each animal shown, including any calf-at-side, must be presented to a representative of the show at the time the cattle arrive on the premises. Application for a BBU Certificate of Breeding on calves under 30 days of age must be represented. Official scramble registration papers with appropriate show stamp must be presented at check-in.

- I. Substitutions will be allowed up to check-in time. There will be a substitution fee of \$5 per animal.
- J. All heifers must be registered with Beefmaster Breeders United as a purebred and out of a BBU-Certified Purebred dam, Second cross dam or as otherwise stated in the BBU by-laws. All heifers shall be inspected to ensure that all identification numbers and holding brands branded or tattooed on the animal and the description match identically with the BBU Certificate of Breeding.
- K. All heifers shall be inspected to ensure that all identification numbers and holding brands branded or tattooed on the animal and the description match identically with the BBU Certificate of Breeding.
- L. Any heifer that, in the opinion of the designated BBU official, would be a detriment to the breed shall be removed from the show, regardless of any prior classification. Examples would be heifers exhibiting signs of low fertility, genetic or physical defects.
- M. Any uncontrollable heifer will be dismissed from the ring at the discretion of the judge.
- N. All heifers must have been owned by the entrant a minimum of 60 days prior to the show. Evidence of ownership is indicated by the date of sale on the registration certificate.
- O. Joint ownership, when both owners are JBBA members, will be accepted. However, animal(s) must be entered and exhibited in the name of one of the owners. Joint ownership, consisting of parent-youth, combination of adult and youth, will not be eligible. The major shows may require single ownership.
- P. There is no limit to the number of heifers an exhibitor may enter.
- Q. Heifers that do not show the day of month of birth on their BBU Certificate of Breeding shall be considered to be born on the first day of that month.
- R. Animals shall be shown with their hair coats laying downward in a natural state that is flat to the entire body, which includes the legs as well as the tail. Furthermore, no animals shall be shown that has any foreign object(s) glued to or otherwise attached or its natural hair color altered in a manner so as to change its conformation or appearance.
- S. A class may be split at the discretion of the show official/coordinator. Every effort will be made to split the class on a monthly basis.
- T. Heifers two (2) years and older on the day shown whose calf has died cannot be shown.
- U. All heifers two (2) years old and older on the day shown must be palpated safe in calf by a licensed veterinarian and so state on the health certificate, with the exception of heifers nursing their natural calf-at-side (under 6 months of age), in which case the heifer may show open. Heifers that do not show the day of month of birth on their BBU Certificates of Breeding shall be considered to be born on the first day of that month.
- V. Failure to comply with these rules or to cooperate with the show and breed officials shall be grounds for removal.

ELIGIBILITY OF EXHIBITS

- A.** All entries in this department are subject to the General Rules and Regulations, the Junior Livestock Show Rules, and the Special Rules of this department.
- B.** Animals must be registered in the International Brangus Breeders Association (IBBA) to be eligible to compete in an IBBA-sponsored show. The registration certificate or photocopy for each entry must be available for presentation to the superintendent or show manager at the time entries are verified prior to judging.
- C.** The IBBA, and its representatives, have the authority to require such tests as they deem necessary to verify the accuracy of the classification and pedigree of exhibited Brangus animals. Said authority shall extend to, and cover the enforcement of, all show rules as adopted by the IBBA.
- D.** The registration number, permanent animal identification number (brand or tattoo), birth date and sire of each animal entered in an individual class must be listed on the entry form.
- E.** Prior to check-in, heads of breeding animals must be clipped of all hair (including topknots) and be free of scurs and/or slick spots.
- F.** Any animal found to have scurs and/or slick spots, or evidence of incisions, surgical or otherwise, in the following areas: head, testicles, sheath, navel or dewlap, will be disqualified from showing.
- G.** Any animal upon check-in which does not have a legible tattoo or brand corresponding to its registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo/brand, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show. The brand/tattoo can be corrected and rechecked at the next available show.
- H.** Any Brangus animal recorded in the IBBA registry that has a "Parentage Dispute" listed in its first three-generation pedigree is ineligible for participation in Brangus shows and exhibitions. If the dispute is resolved, the listing will be removed from the pedigree and show eligibility will be restored.
- I.** In IBBA sanctioned shows, no animal may be shown that has been artificially filled with any amount of liquid at anytime once the animal enters the grounds of a show. The fitter or ranch entity involved with an animal being artificially filled will be banned from the show ring for one year and the animal will be disqualified from exhibition at that particular show. The official show veterinarian may administer liquids

orally, if so needed, without disqualifying animal(s) from exhibition.

J. No animal may be shown that has had any foreign objects glued to or otherwise attached in a manner so as to alter its conformation or change its appearance. Tail ties and hair nets used on the tail and switch are the only exceptions.

K. Entries that have not complied with all of the above rules will not be eligible to show, to receive premium monies, or earn points in the IBBA's Show Sire of the Year, Show Bull of the year, and Show Heifer of the Year awards.

L. All IBBA and IJBBA members will abide by the show rules as adopted. In addition, any show, fair, event or display in which Brangus cattle participate should follow these rules as adopted by IBBA. All Brangus entries are subject to the provision of a rule of the IBBA entitled "Inspection of Exhibits".

INSPECTION OF EXHIBITS

- 1.** The IBBA and its representatives have the authority to require such tests as they deem necessary to verify the accuracy of the classification and pedigree of exhibited Brangus animals. Said authority shall extend to and cover the enforcement of all show rules as adopted by IBBA.
- 2.** Each exhibitor shall submit his or her registered Brangus cattle to such tests and examinations as requested and/or required by the IBBA, its authorized representatives, or those of the relevant show.
- 3.** For, and in consideration of, the opportunity to participate in any Brangus function, each exhibitor hereby releases the IBBA, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits, and judgments past, present, or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decisions there from.
- 4.** Dental Inspection: All entries may be classified for judging on an age basis and should be entered in class according to age. Teeth may be inspected by a veterinarian designated by IBBA in order to determine whether dental development is within allowable limits for the class entered. If the veterinarian determines that, in his or her opinion, dental development exceeds maximum allowable limits, the animal shall be moved to an older class as determined by the veterinarian and shall remain in that class until determined otherwise by subsequent mouthing or favorable appeal to the IBBA Executive Committee. If it is not possible to move an animal, the animal may not be exhibited in such show.
- 5.** Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any such test, exam or show rule enforcement as applied to his or her animal shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the Rules of the IBBA.
- 6.** Appeal: An appeal from the decision of the veterinarian or IBBA-designated association representatives under sections 1 and 4 of the "Inspection of Exhibits" may be made to the Executive Committee of the IBBA if the following requirements are satisfied: 1) The appeal is in writing and is signed by the appealing party, and 2) the appealing party files the written appeal with the IBBA Executive Committee as soon as possible after the veterinarian's or designated association representative's decision was made. If an appeal

satisfying the foregoing requirements filed with the IBBA Executive Committee, then said committee shall hold a hearing at which the appealing party, and the veterinarian or designated association representative whose decision is being appealed shall present statements and other evidence that are relevant to the matter, following which the Executive Committee shall render a decision which shall be final and conclusive.

IBBA BLOOD TYPING FOR PARENTAGE VERIFICATION

A. Each Brangus animal for which an entry application or registration is received may be subjected to a blood typing test in order to verify both accuracy of percentage and blood type, according to Rules 1 and 2 of the International Brangus Breeders Association (IBBA) Inspection of Exhibits.

B. At selected shows and fairs, blood samples will be taken from all division champions and reserve division champions for the purpose of verifying parentage and blood type. Staff or representatives of IBBA will supervise the collection of blood samples, which can be taken at shows, fairs, and events where IBBA contributes premium money or where IBBA staff personnel participate. Cost of the blood typing procedure will be paid for by IBBA.

C. If a recorded parent is excluded (as a parent) as a result of blood typing, the owner of the animal may request, at his or her own expense, further determination of the actual parent. Failure to determine the sire and dam will result in the animal being listed in the IBBA Registry as a "Parentage Dispute", and the animal will be ineligible for future shows and exhibitions.

- D.** Each Exhibitor is entitled to enter two steers in the Steer Show. The steers may be purebred, high grade or crossbred. The steers must have been owned by the exhibitor prior to June 30, 2010. Registration papers or photocopies must be sent with the entry form to show management for verification of age, color and parentage.
- F. All Llamas will present a Veterinary Certificate issued within the last 30 days upon entry at gate.
